
We helped 45 precious animals find their forevers in May, too! It may be hard to say goodbye to these little cuties sometimes, but we know each one is happy, loved, and thriving. To all our adopters, enjoy your new family members and have a WONDERFUL life!

Join us in celebrating a HUGE milestone this month! Thanks to our dedicated fosters. volunteers, and community donors, we passed 1,000 LIVES SAVED through our rescue and rehabilitation program on May 16. None of these animals would be as happy and healthy as they are today without people like you stepping up and putting in the work.



With so many lives impacted, it's hard to believe rescue and rehabilitation is only a small part of what we do. We have so many programs, and each of them is essential to the animals of this community!

Through our bi-weekly transports to Operation Spay Bay in Panama City (plus 1 extra trip this past month), we made spay/neuter services accessible for 163 cats and 7 dogs. That's 170 animals that won't have unwanted litters now!



This month's Bowl Fillers was a huge success thanks to community donations, too. We wound up with no Bowl Fillers sponsor in May, but we were still able to provide local seniors with much-needed pet food through Meals on Wheels because of your donations! We gave away 221 pounds of dog food and 101 pounds of cat food to 10 families with 14 dogs and 16 cats.

We can't say this enough: THANK YOU for your support! We couldn't do it without you!

Our Pet Food Pantry had an extra special May. Volunteers came out on Mother's Day to help provide food for 7 families with 10 dogs and 10 cats. Thanks to your donations, we gave out 181 pounds of dry dog food and 51 pounds of dry cat food, plus 43 cans of wet food, 4 packages of flea and tick medicine, puppy pads, and treats. The real kicker? We were COMPLETELY out of dog food only a few days before Pantry day. But our awesome community came through, and we ended up with plenty of supplies to feed these animals in need.



But wait...there's more! We put the FUN in fundraising last month. Volunteers worked concessions at two Blue Wahoos games, and in return, a portion of the proceeds for both nights were donated to further our mission. Thank you, Blue Wahoos, for letting us participate!

Thanks to Your Pace Yoga, too, for partnering with us on our Kitten Yoga fundraiser. We had a blast, and we hope you did, too! Stay tuned, because we might do it again in the future!

TAIL ME ABOUT IT!

Narelle asks: I love my fat cat Bandit, but he's the fussiest cat I've ever had when it comes to eating. He only likes the "best" dried pellet food. I've tried to feed him everything I can think of, including tinned wet cat foods, but he doesn't want any of it. Any suggestions as to how to get him to eat some protein instead of just dried food all the time?

Did you know that well-balanced dry foods have all the protein your cat needs? And that's not all! As long as you choose a "complete" dry food like IAMS Healthy Adult (which is what we feed our adult kitties), your cat can get all his or her nutrients from dry food. Plus, the crunchy texture prevents plaque build-up and supports dental health.

So, if dry food is all your kitty will eat, that's perfectly fine! Cats have sharp instincts, and they know what they need.

One notable downside of dry food: It doesn't provide any moisture. If your cat eats a diet of all or mostly dry food, it's important to make sure he or she drinks plenty of water every day. Encourage your cat to drink more water by:

- · Setting up multiple drinking stations
- Purchasing a cat water fountain that keeps the water constantly in motion
- Keeping your cat's water far away from its litterbox

Basically, it sounds like Bandit is doing just fine. Keep feeding him his favorite dry food, pay attention to how much water he's drinking, and you're good.
