She was the catalyst which started the transformation of the mindsets in the Florida panhandle by sharing infographics and research on the thousands of animals killed in Santa Rosa County each year. Brandi presented statistics and other pertinent data to the county commissioners in 2018 which led to the lifting of the breed discrimination policies the local shelter had in place. Also in 2018, she engaged the City of Milton officials and created the first ordinance to allow for community cats in a controlled Trap/Neuter/Return program. In 2019, the entire county of Santa Rosa followed suit and became community cat friendly and started saving more lives than ever. In 2020, the Santa Rosa County animal shelter euthanized the last animal just for being pregnant. The greatest show of how the community came together was in 2021, when the statistics showed a complete flip of numbers, now saving over 90% of the animals in their care.

Brandi's team, A HOPE (Animal Health Outreach Prevention Education, has transported over 8,000 animals to be spayed/neutered in a county 2.5 hours away since 2017. They have a Rescue & Rehabilitation program which saves and adopts out over 500 animals each year.

Brandi is a major advocate for all animals yet her passion is in fancy rats and neonate kittens. Each year their team rescues and adopts out over 40 rats! Brandi is a Story Corps participant, multi grant recipient, and leader for all topics helping to keep pets in homes. Currently, A HOPE owns 25 acres in Milton, Florida and are building the county's first affordable spay and neuter clinic.
